### Welcome

*Words of welcome are given by a Churchwarden of St Mary's*

### Opening Hymn

*Informal words of welcome are said and the children collect  
their cross from the altar before going out to their activities.*

### Prayer of Preparation

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Gloria (sung)

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.  
Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,  
with the Holy Spirit,

*At the end of the reading the reader says*

This is the word of the Lord.

**Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading

*When the Gospel is announced the reader says*

**Glory to you, O Lord.**

*At the end*

This is the Gospel of the Lord.  
**Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon

*After the sermon a short period of silent reflection is kept,  
before we stand to declare our faith.*

The Creed

Let us declare our faith in God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God, begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father.**

**Through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary,  
and was made man.**

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven**

**and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,  
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice  
made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread  
of life and cup of salvation,  
we proclaim his death and resurrection  
until he comes in glory.

Giving of Communion

*The president invites the people to receive Communion:*

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

*At the distribution the minister says to each communicant:*

The body of Christ or The blood of Christ.

*The communicant replies each time **Amen**, and then receives.*

*All are welcome to receive the bread and wine of Holy Communion. If you do not wish to receive Communion, please come forward to the altar rail for a blessing and bring this booklet with you.*

During Communion

*An anthem is usually sung by the Choir followed by a hymn in which all are invited to join*

Prayers after Communion

The President prays the prayer on the readings sheet

we give you thanks and praise,  
that when we were still far off  
you met us in your Son and brought us home.  
Dying and living, he declared your love,

Keep us firm in the hope you have set before us,  
so we and all your children shall be free,  
and the whole earth live to praise your name;  
through Christ our Lord.
