Giving of Communion

The President invites the people to receive Communion:

At the distribution the minister says to each communicant:

The body of Christ. or The blood of Christ.

*The communicant replies each time **Amen**, and then receives. All Christians who normally receive Communion in their own churches, are most welcome to do so here. If you do not wish to receive Communion, please come forward to the altar rail for a blessing.*

During Communion

An anthem is usually sung by the Choir followed by a hymn in which all are invited to join.
